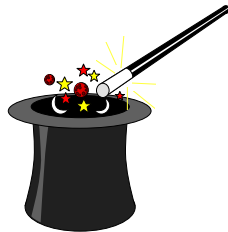


The Magic of God

Prom Praise at The Sage

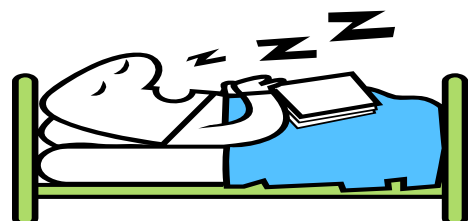

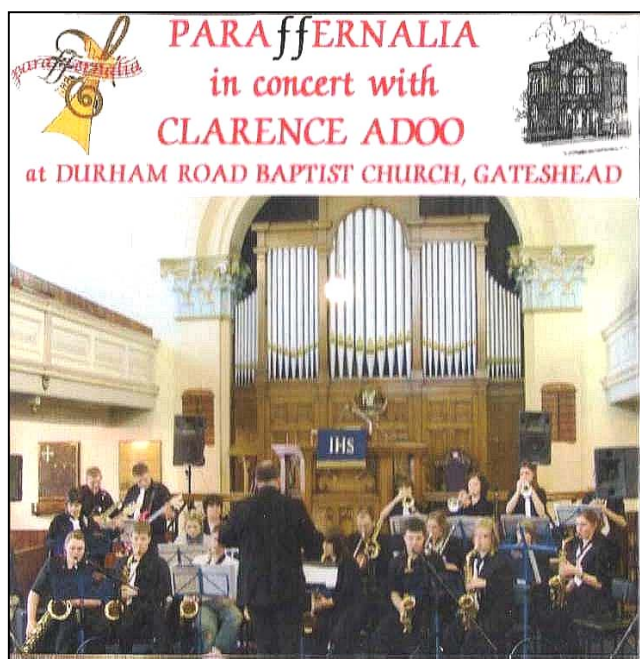


Christmas is coming!

Amazing Faith

During our Sunday evening services last month, we spent time looking at the remarkable writings of God's prophet Habakkuk. He lived around 600 BC in the years leading up to the Babylonian invasion of Judah.

In the opening chapter of the book, we are introduced to Habakkuk's burden – *why doesn't God do something*, he cries out in despair (Hab 1.1-4). Why doesn't God step in to right all the wrongs in the world around about me? And how long must I keep on praying about the situation in which I find myself, without anything ever seeming to happen to it? Habakkuk was wrestling with the problem of unanswered prayer, as we often do.

But having spent time in quiet contemplation before God (*The LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before him*, Hab 2.20), Habakkuk moves on to record one of the greatest expressions of faith in God to be found anywhere in the Bible.

Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will be joyful in God my Saviour. The Sovereign LORD is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to go on the heights.
[Habakkuk 3.17-19]

Habakkuk knew that however difficult life might get for him and his people (as they awaited the Babylonian invasion of their country), God was his Saviour – and that was always a source of joy for him! He also knew that God would be his all-sufficient strength for whatever lay ahead of him – so much so, that a man who began his book in the depths of despair ends it by speaking about standing on the heights! What an inspiration Habakkuk is to each one of us. None of us knows what the future holds – but we know who holds the future, and in Him we can always rejoice!
